## Ask for Audi Authorized Collision Repair.

If you have collision insurance, here are some tips to keep in mind:

- > The insurance company must provide you a copy of your policy.
- > You may not need to wait until your policy is up for renewal before canceling or changing your insurance.<sup>4</sup>
- > You can request that your insurer and repair facility use Audi Genuine Parts and Audi-approved repair procedures.<sup>5</sup>

- > Audi Authorized Collision Repair Facility Technicians are trained to recalibrate driver-assist, collision avoidance systems, and use factory-approved procedures designed to bring your Audi back to the original factory specifications.
- > Audi Genuine Parts are engineered, manufactured, and tested to help maintain the original performance of your vehicle, help restore it to factory specifications after repair, and are backed by a limited warranty.<sup>2</sup>
- > Limited lifetime warranty provided on paint repairs through OEM paint suppliers.<sup>3</sup>

## What to do in case of a collision:

- Move your vehicle to a **safe, well-lit area**, no matter how minor the collision.
- Notify local police, and request medical assistance if necessary.
- Prepare your driver's license, registration, and insurance for the police.
- Collect names and phone numbers of occupants of involved vehicle(s), witnesses, and any injured parties.
- Document vehicle and scene with your smartphone camera.
- If necessary, you can contact Audi Roadside Assistance<sup>1</sup> and have your vehicle towed to your Audi Authorized Collision Repair Facility.
- Notify your insurance provider.
